Some units of study integrate more than one process or medium. The techniques and skills are organized sequentially to develop manipulative and problem-solving skills, building upon prior knowledge and art skills. Students work at their own individual level of ability within the context of the lesson's objective, and are thus assessed. They have the ability to develop a concentration as in higher level art classes (GT allowance). Journals can reflect the theme in a student's concentration demonstrating a variety of media and techniques. This roadmap is meant to reflect the variety in process and media available for students in a quality elementary art program. Changes may be necessary due to funding, media or space allowances.
